### Sentence Combining to Make Compound Verbs

**New Directions:** In this lesson, you'll start with a base sentence, then use a conjunction to add part of the second, the part which contains the verb. In this way, you'll have a sentence with one subject and a COMPOUND VERB (2 verbs). You won't need a comma in front of the conjunction.

1. **They knew of the problem.** They had no solution for it. (yet)
2. **I know the new road to Montebello.** I have no car. (but)
3. **Debbie knew the answers.** She passed the test. (and)
4. **You must give the password.** You must go back. (or)
5. **The dog took the paper in its mouth.** The dog carried it home. (and)
6. **The team played badly.** The team won anyway. (but)
7. **No player may break the rules.** No player may argue with an umpire. (or)
8. **He didn't know anything.** He kept on talking. (yet)
9. **I have new glasses.** I can see much better now. (and)
10. **The children knew the secret.** They wouldn't tell anyone. (yet)
