

Joining Words and Phrases

New Directions: Conjunctions such as *and* and *or* can join single words or phrases inside a base sentence. In these sentences, start with the base sentence and add to it, using the conjunctions.

1. **We had ice cream at the party.** [We had cake at the party. (and)]
2. **The dance will be held in June.** [The dance will be held in July. (or)]
3. **The coach wanted tall girls for the basketball team.** [The coach wanted fast girls for the basketball team. (and)]
4. **The jogger ran up the street.** [The jogger ran into a house. (and)]
5. **The Girl Scouts will need more money.** [The Boy Scouts will need more money. (and)]
6. **There will be a medal for the winner.** [There will be a prize for the winner. (and)]
7. **We'll paint the car orange.** [We'll paint the car maroon. (or)]
8. **You can buy cotton candy at the booths.** [You can buy popcorn at the booths. (and)] [You can buy them from a vendor. (or)]
9. **The girls will play softball.** [The boys will play softball. (and)] [They will play soccer. (and)] They will play them together.
10. **The tomatoes will make a salad.** [They are the tomatoes from our garden. The lettuce will make a salad. (and)] It is lettuce from yours.
