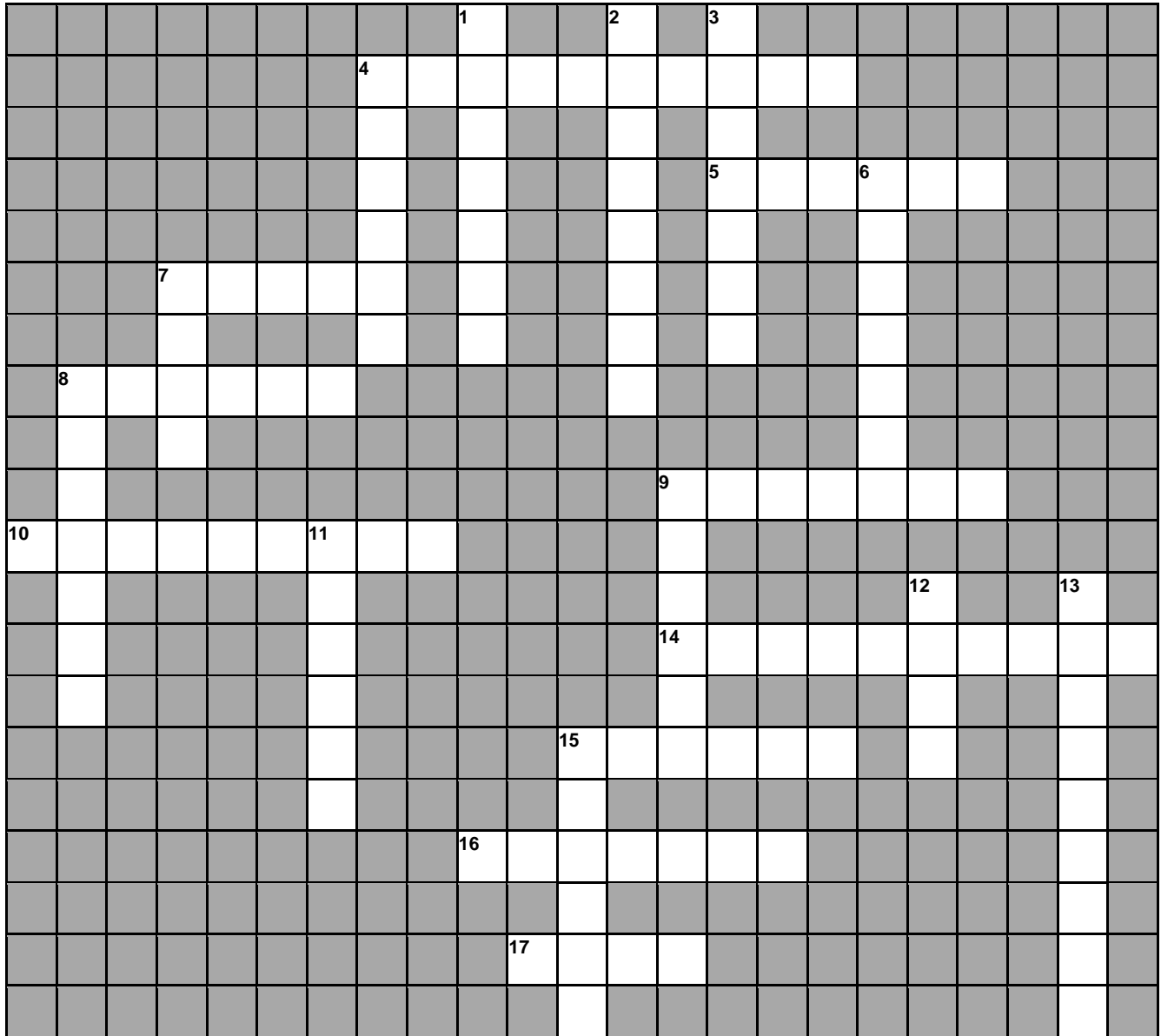


Spelling Lesson 02: Homophones
