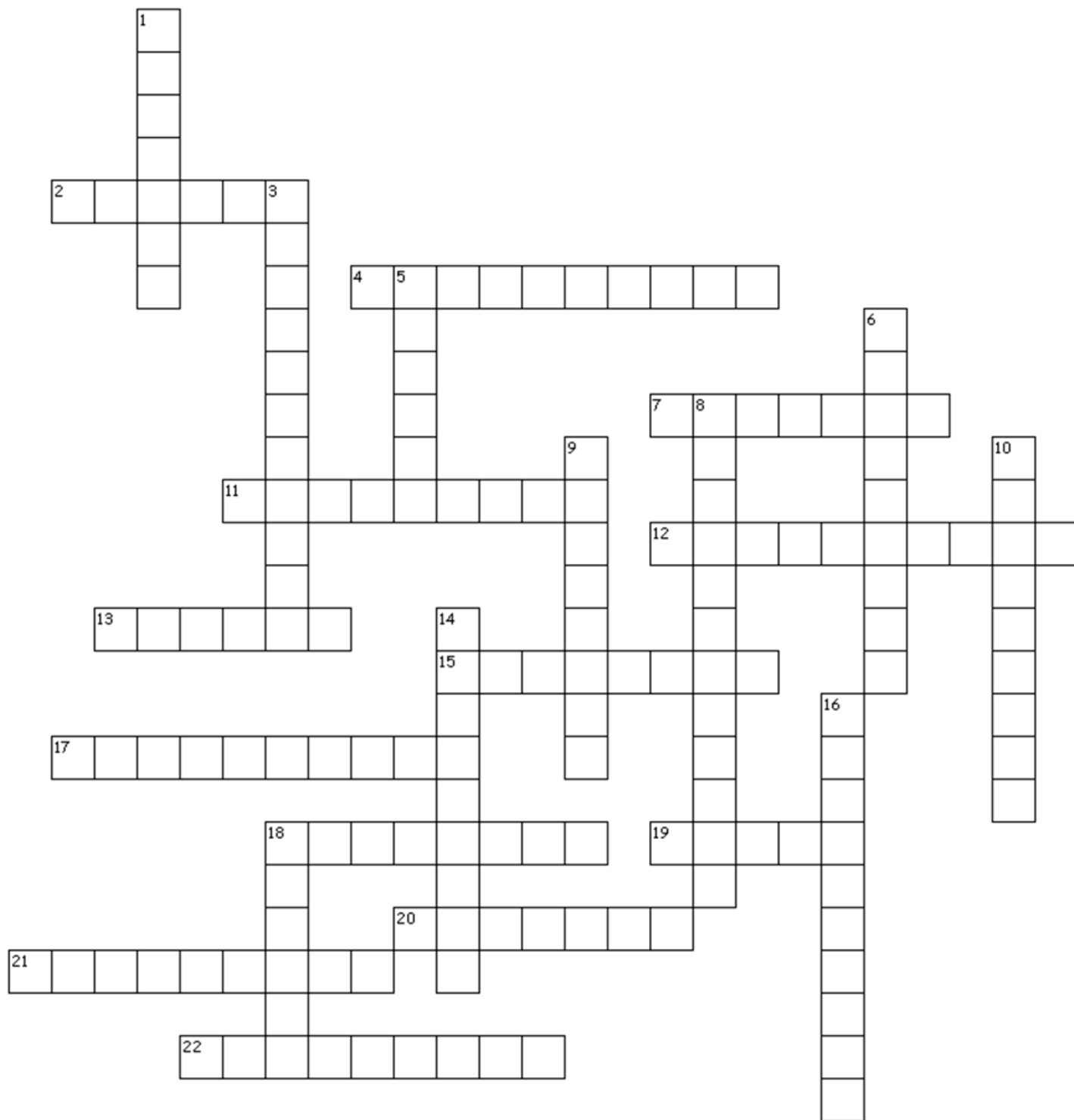


Spelling Lesson 11: Words from Greek
