Language Arts — 8th-Grade Writing Assignment **Research Paper**

Objective: Students will be able to write an effective, thesis-driven research paper using primary and

secondary resources. (Standards W2.3, W2.4)

Prompt 1: In four short years you will be contemplating your first year in college — so it's not too

late to begin thinking now about where you might attend college and why. You are to gather information about where you might attend college and why, including academic data such as program offerings, specialties, entrance requirements, and rankings; be sure to look at all of the information through the lens of your own interests and goals. All of this information and more will be required in order to formulate and support your thesis. A form has been provided to help you write your thesis and gather the information you

will need.

Prompt 2: Formulate a hypothesis related to an area of study in your science class and research your hypothesis. Your research may include any experiments you perform as part of your

research.

Thesis Examples: The asteroid belt posses a very real risk to Earth for which we should and can prepare.

Gravity bends space and time.

As certain life forms in the deep oceans have demonstrated, the sun's energy is not

necessary for the existence of life on Earth.

Prompt 3: Formulate a thesis related to an area of study in your history class and research your

thesis. Your research must include at least two primary sources.

Thesis Examples: The Bill of Rights was critical to the ratification of the United States Constitution.

The modern interpretation of the church-state relationship is inconsistent with what the

Framers envisioned.

Slavery was the primary, root cause of the American Civil War.
